GDC Baramulla hosts talk show on 'India since Independence: A Model of Development

The National Service Scheme (NSS) in collaboration with NCC contingent, Government Degree College (GDC), Baramulla hosted a talk show titled 'India since Independence: A Model of Development', second in the series of weeklong activities/events, under the banner, Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav (India@75) and Independence Day_2021. Prof. Riyaz Ahmad Wani, Head, Department of Political Science, GDC, Baramulla was the speaker on the occasion, heard and appreciated by roughly 70 participants, including NSS volunteers, NCC contingent, teaching and non-teaching faculty of the host-college.



Prof. (Dr.) Mushtaq Ahmad Lone, Principal of the college, formally opened up the event and welcomed the guest speaker and participants of the programme.
